

OBERHAUSBERGEN - G.F.WALTHER ORGAN in Ste Odile
jOrgan 311 FS disposition - Jeuxdorgues1

Inspired by jeuxdorgues1 sf2 bank of Joseph Basquin, I reworked the samples, separated them from their combinations found on the original bank and constructed from the start a jOrgan disposition.

In this edition (jOrgan v.311), some issues with samples of Bourdon 8 & Cymbale stops are corrected, as some other small things.

I introduced new draw stop levers, console background & wooden labels and two lights -red & green - to open when the rec button and play button in recorder are selected respectively.

Two foot pedals are added, a classic swell for clavier II and a general crescendo, with the convenience of the player in mind, as these are not present in the original Walther.

Two memory extensions are to be found, a default and one with famous organ composers for storing different combinations for their works.

I added the photo of Walther organ as found in Jeux d' Orgues site and two more I found in Ste Odile's official site. Thank you !

Play Oberhaus.mid with the recorder (open it with view first select and close), it's just an improvisation I did for Walther.

Play also Giovanni de Macque's Consonanze Midi file, kinda rare piece of music.
